Course Objective: The purpose of mastering the educational discipline “Palliative care in geriatrics” is to master the knowledge for the reception and examination of elderly patients, as well as the principles of organizing therapeutic and preventive care in the prehospital, hospital, and hospice stages, the skills and abilities of recognizing diseases, treatment tactics and prevention of diseases in this age group, their management.
